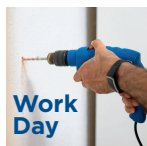

August 23, 8am

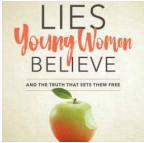

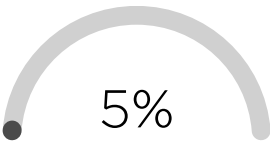
