Westminster Shorter Catechism No. 17-19

Leader: What happened to man in the fall?

People: Man fell into a condition of sin and misery.

All: The sinfulness of that fallen condition is twofold. SCRIPTURE

Jeremiah 2:1-13; 19

2 The LORD gave me another message. He said, ²“Go and shout this message to Jerusalem. This is what the LORD says:

“I remember how eager you were to please me

³In those days Israel was holy to the LORD,

June 28, 8am

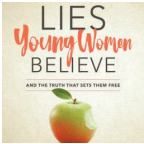

MISSIONS UPDATE

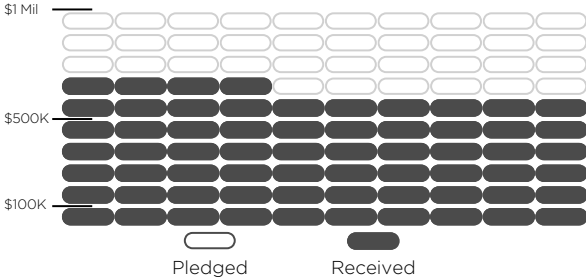
July Missionary of the Month

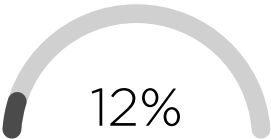

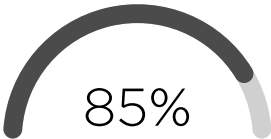
